Reps. Adams and Hudson Host NC Congressional Award Ceremony

Concord, NC — On Thursday, August 16, 2018, **Congresswoman Alma Adams (NC-12)** and **Congressman Richard Hudson (NC-08)** hosted the 2018 North Carolina Congressional Award Ceremony & 4-H Kick-Off.

The event recognized youth for setting goals that positively impacted their community and challenged themselves personally. Each Bronze, Silver, and Gold Medalist logged hundreds of hours in four program areas – Voluntary Public Service, Personal Development, Physical Fitness, and Expedition/Exploration.



Charlotte Motor Speedway served as the host venue, granting medalists and their guests special access to The Speedway Club event space.

Aric Almirola, NASCAR driver of the No. 10 Smithfield Ford Fusion for **Stewart-Haas Racing**, served as keynote speaker.

The ceremony was also a strategic effort to showcase the Foundation's partnership with **4-H**, a youth-centric organization with a strong footprint in the Tar Heel State.

Keeping with the spirit of the two youth development programs, the event was capped off with a service project. Youth participants assembled hundreds of hygiene kits to be delivered to deployed U.S. military service members.

Mike Skahill, Vice President of Government Affairs at Smithfield Foods and Congressional Award Foundation board member, delivered the congratulatory remarks on behalf of event sponsor, **Smithfield Foods**.
