CONGRESSIONAL SPEAKERS

A native St. Louisan, Congressman Wm. Lacy Clay was first elected to Congress in 2000, succeeding his father, the Honorable Bill Clay, who served for 32 years and was a founding Member of the Congressional Black Caucus. He is currently serving his 9th term. Clay is a senior member of the House Financial Services Committee, the Oversight and Government Reform Committee, and holds a seat on the House Natural Resources Committee.

Missouri's 2nd district has always been home for Congresswoman Ann Wagner. Wagner previously served as U.S. Ambassador to Luxembourg, Co-Chair of the Republican National Committee, and Chairwoman of the Missouri Republican Party.

The Congressional Award is the United States Congress' only charity and the highest honor bestowed upon young Americans. The program is open to all young people ages 13 1/2 to 23. Participants earn Bronze, Silver, and Gold Certificates and Bronze, Silver, and Gold Medals. Each level involves setting goals in four program areas: Voluntary Public Service, Personal Development, Physical Fitness, and Expedition/Exploration.

THE AWARD IN MISSOURI

Missouri remains one of the most active states in The Congressional Award's national portfolio, ranking 13th out of all U.S. states and territories in total number of participants.

The Show Me State has produced 1,773 awardees all-time. There are currently 891 participants pursuing the award across the state. In the past year, Congressional Award participants in Missouri have contributed 10,735 hours of voluntary public service to their communities.
